An ACT Doubleheader: The Well in the Woods and Loving Louisa!

On Friday and Saturday evenings, January 28th and 29th, ACT will be presenting an unusual and fun night of theater at Arlington Center for the Arts: two original plays written by two young playwrights, winners of ACT's Second Annual Young Playwrights Competition!

The Well in the Woods, the first place winner, written by Arlington resident 13 year old Alexandra Huzsvai, tells the story of two princesses running away from their



evil stepmother in order to save the king, their dying father. With a cast of over 25 ACTors and directed by AHS students Laura Mulvey and Amy Young, this is sure to be a fun-filled show.

After a brief intermission, ACT will present the much-shorter adult-themed *Loving Louisa*, written by Julie Ann Berger, a 16 year old student from New Jersey.

Loving Louisa is the story of a mild-mannered, Sinatra-loving man's journey into madness who brings a beautiful marionette home to his wife. Directed by AHS student Hannah Allen and starring four ACTors.
