Summary of position:

Apprentices-in-Training will work directly with and receive mentorship and training from Camp Director Sarah Smith. They will assist in developing, planning, preparing, and implementing our Summer Day Program productions of *Getting to Know...Once Upon Mattress* and *The Little Mermaid Jr*. Apprentices-in-Training will focus on learning about aspects of Directing, Choreography, Stage Management, and Set and Costume Design. Education and process will be at the center of each of these programs with the final performance being considered a sharing and celebration of work instead of a full production.

Responsibilities:

- Support, encourage, and guide young ACTors in all aspects of the production process.
- Facilitate intentional, educational games and activities for small groups of children.
- Create a positive learning experience for every young person involved.
- Engage all young ACTors regardless of role cast in.
- Assist in creating a clear code of conduct and hold young people accountable for their actions.
- Contribute to a fun, but disciplined rehearsal environment.
- Help children feel comfortable, included, affirmed and safe.
- Be a positive role model.
- Be an ambassador for Arlington Children's Theatre and its mission.

- Be able to assist in the planning and implementation of a theatrical educational program with the focus being on process and communication.
- Develop your artistic, creative and educational voice.
- Be able to collaborate with a team of other young theatre artists.
- Engage with young actors and develop your skills in controlling small groups and maintaining consistent discipline and working practices.

- Ability to collaborate and work with a team of other artists/educators.
- Ability to work with and lead young actors with empathy and a sense of humor.
- Previous experience with education/working with young actors.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills.
- A love of theatre and/or education.
